STUDENT COMPETITIONS

The preliminary rounds of the annual Sir Winston Churchill Speech and Debate Competitions were held on November 25th, 2017 at the University of Alberta in the Humanities Centre, with the help of the University of Alberta Debate Society. The tournament director committee consisted of Ms. Sarah Fong (*our director of student competitions; ed.*), and several members of UADS.

The topic for debate was "Be it resolved that Churchill would support cyber attacks against Russia." The topic for speeches was "Express your views on whether Sir Winston Churchill would support cyber attacks against Russia." A preparatory package was provided to each student.


Registration comprised 40 debaters and 7 speech competitors. Eight schools participated: Old Scona Academic High School, Harry Ainlay High School, Edmonton Islamic Academy, Blessed Oscar Romero Catholic High School, McNally High School, Salisbury High School, W.P. Wagner High School, and Tempo School.

There were three rounds of speech and debate. The top three in the speech category and top two teams in the debate category competed in the final rounds, which were held on Tuesday, December 5th, 2017 at the newly renovated McKay Avenue School.

The winners, in order of gold, silver, and bronze medals were, for speech: Navya Baradi (Old Scona Academic), Ebun Akomolafe (Old Scona Academic), and Benny Wolde (Old Scona Academic). In debate, the winners were Kelly He and Amanda Kennedy (Old Scona Academic), who competed against Neha Garg and Amina Mohamed (McNally High School).

Two of the gold medalists provided some biographical information:

Navya Baradi, winner of the Arthur O. Cload trophy for speech, was a student at Old Scona Academic. She has been active in Grad Council and DECA and was a youth representative of the Telugu Cultural Association of Edmonton, where she also taught as a student teacher. She will be attending the University of Alberta, initially in a science program, and plans to also study Commerce and Law. She would like to work in Law in international affairs, with the Canadian government or with global organizations. She gives back to the community through volunteering at the Edmonton Community Legal Centre. She has won awards in model United Nations and World Health Organization simulations, which she believes help to create better educated global citizens.



Kelly He, also a student at Old Scona Academic, is a co-winner of the Basil Dean Memorial Trophy for debate. Kelly, going into grade 12, is thinking of pursuing an MD PhD. She has served on the executive of the Language Club at Harry Ainlay Composite High School. She has worked on research projects at the University of Alberta: this year a study on the Effects of Microgravity on Knee Meniscus. This project went to the Sanofi Biogenius Competition and won fourth place provincially. Kelly is interested in Asian, especially Chinese, affairs and politics.

The 129 members and guests in attendance had a choice of main course menu items. Service and meals were very good.

John Warnke recognized LCol. Charles (Chuck) Marshall for his many years of service to our Society and presented him with a framed gift containing a portrait of Churchill, a Churchill commemorative coin on a ribbon, and an engraved plaque. Many thanks, Chuck.

Our guest speaker was Alan Watson, Lord Watson of Richmond, CBE: U.K Journalist, politician and Churchill scholar. His engaging talk centered on two speeches Winston Churchill delivered in 1946: his famous “Iron

Curtain” speech in Fulton, Missouri and his “United States of Europe” speech in Zurich. In these speeches Churchill warned America and Europe that the Soviet Union under Stalin had become an expansionist adversary. Political and economic alliances were necessary to thwart Soviet ambitions in Europe. These two speeches marked the beginning of a dialogue which led to European and trans-Atlantic post-war unity. Lord Watson concluded with his long-standing conviction that despite some current ideological trends, the security, prosperity and democratic ideals of Britain, the Commonwealth, Europe and America remain interconnected and interdependent. Insularity is “madness”.

HISTORICAL EVENTS

- 1893** Attends Royal Military College, Sandhurst, subsequent to having tried his entrance three times before successfully passing.
- 1898** Publishes his first book, The Malakand Field Force. He is attached to the 21st Lancers in Egypt. Participates in cavalry charge on September 2 at the battle of Omdurman.
- 1906** Elected as the Liberal candidate for North-West Manchester in a Liberal landslide. Publication of the first volume of Lord Randolph Churchill. (2 Vols.) and For Free Trade.
- 1911** Appointed First Lord of the Admiralty.


THE HEROIC MEMORY

"While many (Churchill) societies (took) tentative steps in their early days the Edmonton Society commenced its annual dinners in 1965 with...a clear requirement of the speakers – they had to have known or worked with Winston Churchill.

The Heroic Memory 1965 – 1989 (ISBN 1-55195-115-0) contains the addresses of the speakers for the first twenty five years, with the list being a veritable Who's Who of distinguished political, military and family figures.

The Heroic Memory, 1990-2014 (ISBN 978-1-77136-412-6) contains the addresses for the second quarter century. While inevitably, with the passage of time, not all had in one speaker's words, "pressed the flesh" they all have provided a fresh insight into Churchill's life and times.

We are indebted to the Edmonton Society for reproducing these addresses, which should have a place in all Churchill libraries, and both books are strongly recommended."


CHURCHILL'S LEGACY: TWO SPEECHES TO SAVE THE WORLD



ARMISTICE 100 VOLUNTEER OPPORTUNITY



A special city-wide event is being planned for November 11, 2018 in Edmonton to commemorate the 100th anniversary of the end of the First World War. An organizing committee is working on preparations with the City and Provincial governments and the Canadian Armed Forces.

The purpose of the event is to acknowledge the sacrifice of 60,000 Canadians soldiers and their families and to honor the ideas and ideals they defended. Planned events include a "Piling of the Drums" ceremony, the Menin Gate re-imagined, WW1

interpretive soldiers, WW1 educational material, a "Memory Wall", The Lord Strathcona Regiment horses & corral along with a Leopard tank, and a new video created specifically for the event: Flander's Fields, a modern interpretation connecting 1918 to 2018.
